#### WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN







Both a gerund and a present continuous come from a verb, and both end in -ing. However, each has a different function. A gerund acts like a noun while a present continuous acts like a verb or adjective.





He is snowboarding.


(present continuous)

\*When *snowboarding* is <u>a gerund</u>, it acts like *a noun*.

It can be a subject, an object, the object of a preposition, or a subject complement.



- -Snowboarding is a winter sport. [subject]
- -I love <u>snowboarding</u>. [ object ]
- -I am excited by <u>snowboarding</u>. [object of a preposition]
- -One popular sport is <u>snowboarding</u>. [subject complement]
